Willowbark Park officially opens at LUMA!

On Saturday 13 April, over 400 residents and neighbours celebrated the opening of Willowbark Park — the new green heart of our LUMA community!

Families enjoyed Easter-themed activities including a lively egg hunt and face painting, while exploring the new park's open lawns, nature-inspired playground, picnic shelters, and barbecues.

A standout feature was the trio of hand-carved timber wombats by Indigenous artist Glenn Romanis - with residents invited to help name them!

Willowbark Park spans 3,600 square metres and prioritises natural design and sustainability, including the planting of more than 40 new trees.

We look forward to seeing Willowbark Park become a favourite gathering place for our growing community!

Stage 2 Construction Well Underway

Construction of 85 new homes in Stage 2 is progressing well, with SAW Constructions leading the works.

All construction activity remains contained within the project site, however residents may notice increased construction traffic during work hours as vehicles move in and out of the site.







Some noise is expected as works continue, but we are working closely with SAW Constructions to manage and minimise impacts wherever possible.

Early 2025: Willowbark Park opens & Stage 1 homes complete



2026

Early 2026: First homes in Stage 2 completed

Mid 2026: All stage 2 homes completed



2027

Pedestrian and vehicle bridge construction commences

Stage 3 home sales commence, followed by civil construction.
